Principles

Autonomy

Respect for individual's choices and self determination.

It is important to obtain
INFORMED CONSENT

Justice

Equal opportunity, risk, benefits and choice to participate in research.

Non-maleficence

Avoiding harm.

Finding the balance between benefits and harm, if necessary.

Beneficence

Promotes the welfare of individuals as the primary goal of health research. Maximizing the benefits of research
